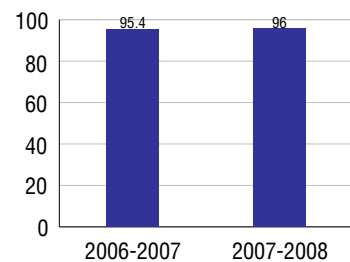

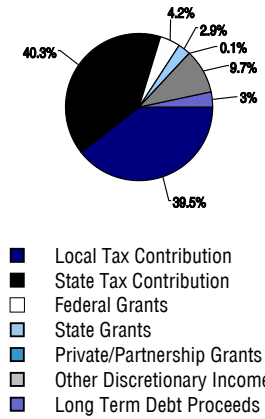

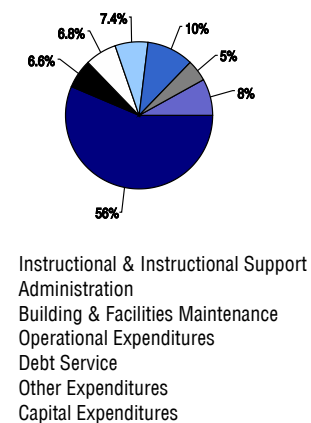

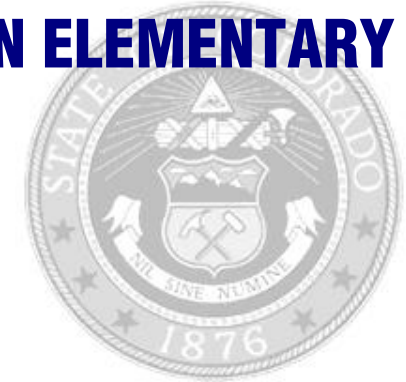

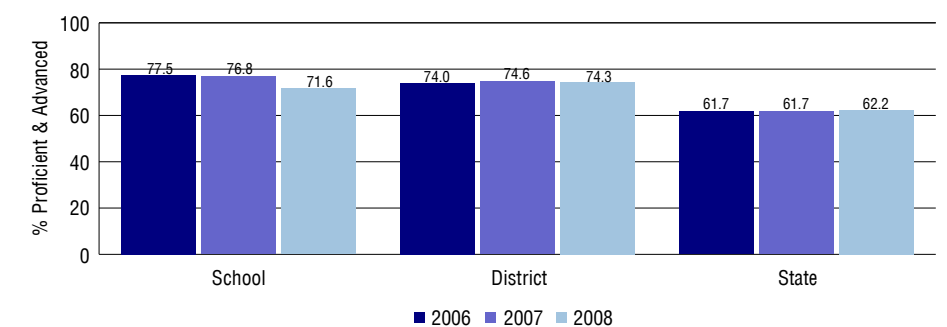
Overall Academic Performance on State Assessments

Each school in the State received a rating of "Excellent", "High", "Average", "Low", or "Unsatisfactory" for student academic performance based on 2007-2008 CSAP and COACT results. The rating is calculated using weighted percentages of each CSAP proficiency level for all content area and grade results for the school, as well as average COACT Reading, Writing, and Math Grade 11 results.

Academic Growth of Students

Each school in the State received a rating of "Low", "Typical", or "High" for student academic growth based on CSAP results. The calculation method is new for 2007-2008. Percent Proficient and Advanced for Elementary Grades for All Content Areas



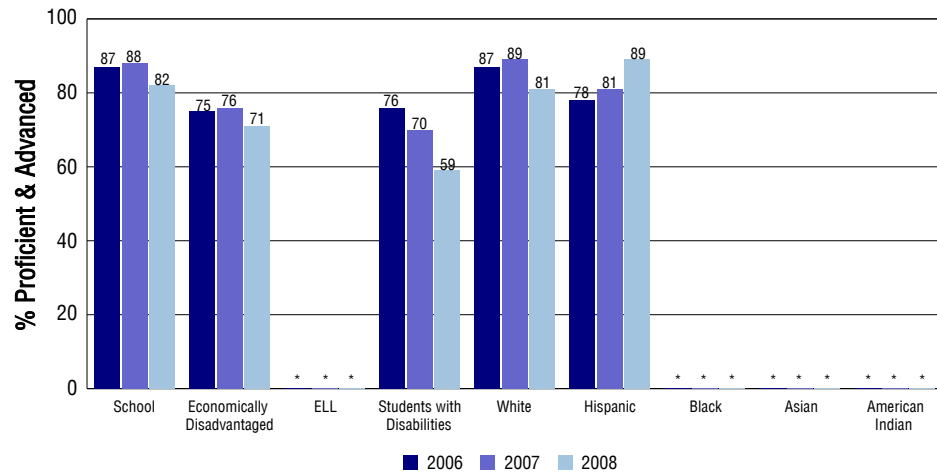

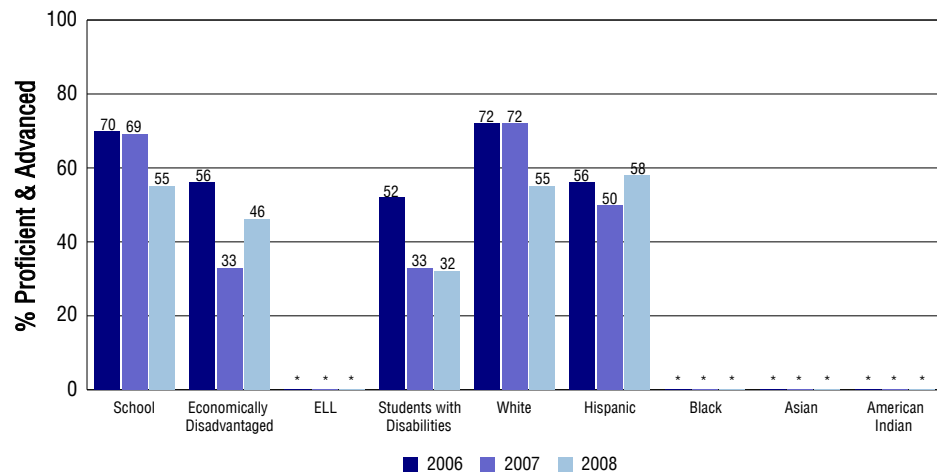

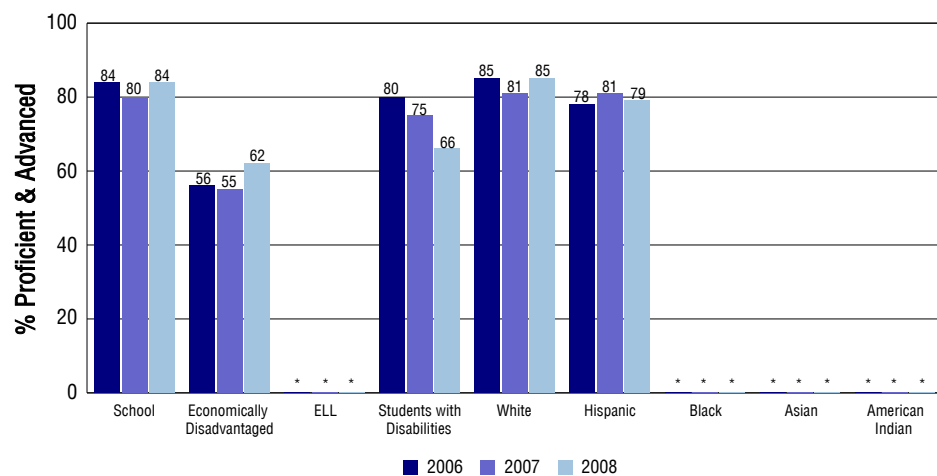
Reading

- Runyon implements a school-wide 'Positive Behavior Support' approach to enhance our capacity to educate all students.
- Runyon teachers and staff are a dedicated and collaborative group who put student learning needs first.

School Goals (as submitted by your district)

First of all, 90% of students will be proficient writers within three years as measured by a body of evidence. Secondly, over a 3 year period of implementing the practices of Professional Learning Communities, 90% of faculty each year will develop new leadership competencies/commitments and document how these are designed to develop the collective capacity of the entire staff as measured by a pre/post survey and a body of evidence. Also, 90% of students identified by ILP and Child Study team as 'at risk for academic failure' in reading will demonstrate at least a year and a half growth each year for the next 3 years as measured by a body of evidence.
