Lori Kinney called the meeting to order

Mike Owens discussed the long term budget issues facing LPS. Superintendent staff is giving the "Budget Matters" presentation to all school accountability groups. The district will not have final numbers from the State until May. We are trying to plan staffing now using best estimates. There is 2 million that the district cannot spend and will most likely need to return to the state in January, 2010. The Governor's recent recommendations call for deeper cuts to K-12 education and translate to \$9 million in cuts or more in LPS for the next school year, depending on the outcome of the 2010 Legislative Session. The Board is scheduled to receive a series of budget-reducing recommendations at its December 10, 2009 meeting. Recommendations will be shaped in part by both the input from the 27 budget conversations and the previous work of the Financial Advisory Committee.

Lucinda joined CEAC members to discuss the H1N1 flu vaccination process. Littleton Public Schools had been asked by the Tri-County Health Department to provide locations for free H1N1 vaccination clinics. Health department experts state that receiving the vaccination is an important preventive step that can be taken. Because of vaccine delays and limited quantities at this time, Tri County Health Department vaccination clinics are limited to residents of Adams, Arapahoe, Broomfield, Douglas and Elbert Counties. However, any LPS student will receive the vaccine regardless of what county they reside.
