## Message from the Principal's Office...

Happy New Year to All of You,

I have just come inside from shoveling AGAIN! Wow – this is a true Colorado winter the likes of which I have not seen in the 46 years I have lived here. I am enjoying every bit of it but I know many residents are growing weary of the cold weather and the four-wheel drive roads. The weather the past month has led me to think about setting goals and sticking to them even when the unexpected happens. Let me explain.



Our 7th snow storm in 7 weeks - When will it end?

In early October I decided to train for the Phoenix ½ marathon which was scheduled for January 14, 2007. Not only did I want to run I was also determined to set a new personal best time. Those of you who are runners will know that if you are going to run 13 miles you need to steadily increase your weekly distance and get in one long run each week. Fortunately, the Highline Canal weaves through the metro area providing a wonderful location for the long Sunday run. Well, when snowstorm #1 dumped two feet of snow the canal, as well as my neighborhood streets, became impassable, especially for a middle-age runner like me! But I persevered through the winter break running each day, including 8, 9 and 10 mile weekly runs on a treadmill. It was dreadful. But last Sunday I completed my goal on the coldest day Phoenix had experienced since 1990! I was ecstatic.

So what does my running have to do with the students at LHS and their achievement? The faculty sets high standards for our students. Every teacher begins the semester hoping that each student will achieve to his or her highest potential. We want every student to successfully pass every class. Unfortunately, we know that goal will not be met. On the first day of class students plan to pass but somewhere along the 18 weeks they get discouraged, fail to complete assignments, or miss too much school. Last semester 29% of our students had two or more D's and/or F's as their final grade. Twenty-seven percent of students had one or more F's for the semester.

How can you help? A distance runner plans their training three to four months in advance and progressively increases their endurance and speed leading up to race week when we can relax a bit

because all the preparation is complete. Students need to plan their semester like it is an 18-week workout. They should begin by setting short and long term goals that lead to the overarching goal of a passing grade. You should insist that your son/daughter is using a daily planner to record homework assignments, long-term projects, upcoming tests and quizzes and reading assignments. Even better they should also schedule time with family and friends, time for exercise, time they may spend at a part-time job, and of course time for adequate sleep! This is an essential ingredient for busy teenagers. Ask your son/daughter to see their planner and show you the corresponding work they will be turning in. Share with them how you plan your day so you maximize your time at work and have quality family time as well as time for yourself. Discuss with your students what they do during any unscheduled time. We are trying to encourage students to use their off periods as academic preparation time. Students need to view unscheduled periods as opportunities to study, go to the library, and see teachers instead of socializing time.

In order to compete in a race you have to plan and persevere even when the going gets rough. Instilling in students the ability to set goals and stick to them will not only help them academically it will help them in all they hope to accomplish.

## Security Measures At LHS

The safety and security of our students and staff is always our top priority. As a result, the following safety and security procedures are still in place at Littleton High School:

- Only the minimum number of access points remain open during school hours.
- Volunteers, parents, and visitors must check in at the main office. A valid picture ID is required in order to obtain a visitor's badge.
- All visitors, including volunteers and parents must wear a visitor's badge if they need access to parts of the school other than the main office.

- Parents will wait in designated drop off and pick up areas and will not go to classrooms unless they have gone through visitor sign-in process.
- Special events, assemblies, etc. will be exempt from the visitor sign-in process.
- After school events will be restricted as much as possible to certain areas of the building through utilization of security gates and doors.
- Outside groups utilizing school facilities after hours will follow community use guidelines.

These measures are intended to supplement policies and procedures that are already in place.

Each school operates a little differently and may not be able to strictly adhere to every guideline, and some modifications will need to be made. We appreciate everyone's cooperation in this important matter.

Of course, no amount of security equipment can replace the importance of staff, students, parents, and community members being ever vigilant of what is happening in and around our school. We cannot guarantee safety, but working together, we can dramatically increase the levels of safety and security in our schools.

## We've Changed Student Schedules...

In our constant endeavors to build responsibility and a strong academic focus in the Littleton High School learning community, we have changed the language on our students' schedules from "EMPTY" to "ACADEMIC PREP". This is a

minor change, but one we feel will help alter the mindset of our students, parents and staff. This name change does not indicate that the student has a scheduled course, but rather that we encourage the student to be using this time to

complete homework assignments, seek help from teachers and friends, do preparatory work for coming classes. Students are encouraged to make the library, café or lobby their study areas.

## The CSAP is Back!! ACT and MAP will follow in April...

CSAP's are a significant measure of our students' progress. At LHS, we value parental support and student attendance during CSAP week. CSAP testing will take place at LHS for four days, starting Tuesday, March 13<sup>th</sup>, and ending Friday, March 16<sup>th</sup>. Here are some key points to be aware of for that week:

- Monday, March 12<sup>th</sup>, is a normal Monday schedule.
- Freshman and Sophomores are required to be here Tuesday through Friday of that week at 7:25.
- Testing will be held in the morning, from 7:25 until 11:10 Tuesday through Friday. Monday will be a normal Monday schedule.
- Lunch will be held from 11:10 to 11:40 on testing days, though it is recommended that students bring a snack to eat during the short breaks in testing.
- The tests will be given as follows:

- ? Tuesday – Math
- ? Wednesday – Science
- ? Thursday – Writing/Reading
- ? Friday – Writing/Reading

- Juniors and Seniors are not required to attend during testing time and should not be in the building in the morning, *EXCEPT* when they are participating in IB and AP review sessions, Senior Plan meetings with advisors, Junior scheduling for '06-'07 classes, or LINK leader activities (on Wednesday only).
- Juniors and Seniors who are not in the building for the above reasons should plan to be in the building for afternoon classes starting at 11:45 a.m. as detailed below.
- ACT testing for all Juniors will be held on Wednesday, April 25<sup>th</sup>, during the

morning at school. It is very important that all juniors are present and ready for the test on that day.

- The spring MAP testing for all 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> grade students will occur in their Language Arts and Math classes during the weeks of April 9<sup>th</sup> and April 16<sup>th</sup>. Make-up testing will be the week of April 23<sup>rd</sup>. More information will be in the April 6<sup>th</sup> edition of this newsletter.
- AP and IB testing for students enrolled in those programs will be held between May 3<sup>rd</sup> and May 25<sup>th</sup>. Please contact Amanda Teegardin (AP) at 303-347-7722, or Claudia Anderson (IB) at 303-347-7724, if you have any questions.

### TURN IN YOUR PARTICIPATION FORMS AND FEES FOR SPRING SPORTS TODAY!

Athletic forms are available in the Athletic Department Office. **A form must be completed and turned in to the Athletic Department for each sport you play.**

A physical is required for all sports. The physical **MUST** be renewed every 12 months. If your physical is current and on file from a previous LHS sport, you may write 'On File' for the physician's signature.

Insurance coverage is mandatory for all student-athletes. If you do not have current coverage, the school can supply information to obtain seasonal coverage at a moderate price.

Student and parent must sign the Athletic Code agreement on the participation form.

The \$100 participation fee is due when you submit your authorization form. The fee is \$100 per sport, \$200 per athlete per year, \$300 per family per year. (Girls' and Boys' Lacrosse fees are excluded from the maximums and are paid directly to the team Booster Club.)

Your participation fee will be returned if you do not make the team.
