- Know and apply grade-level phonics and word analysis skills in decoding words
- Read with sufficient accuracy and fluency to support comprehension
- Learn and use new words
- Ask and answer questions about stories and books who, what, where, when, why, and how
- Read and recount stories, including fables and folktales from different cultures, and identify the lesson or moral of the story
- Read texts about history, social studies, or science and identify the main idea
- Describe the reasons that an author gives to support a point
- Acknowledge differences in the points of view of characters
- Compare and contrast the most important points presented by two texts on the same topic
- Describe the connections between a series of historical events, scientific ideas or concepts
- Participate in class discussion by listening and building on what others are saying
- Describe in their own words information learned from articles or books
- Work together to gather facts and information on a topic
- Write about opinions using important details and examples to support a position
- Write informative texts in which they introduce a topic, use facts and definitions to develop points, and provide a concluding statement
- Write narratives in which they recount a well-elaborated event or short sequence of events, include details to describe actions, thoughts and feelings, use words to signal event order, and provide a sense of closure
